
STORYTIME

-Literacy enhancement through songs, rhymes and books.

-Fostering a lifelong love of reading and the library.

-Learning how to take out and return books, helping check out their books sometimes!

-Parents always appreciate the craft time; one 2year-old expressed her excitement about storytime because she got to use the glue stick. Mum reported she couldn't stop talking about it at home.

-Encouraging young children to develop an interest in reading and learning by providing services for parents and their children.
