

A year in review - by Celia & Eva

Operations returned to normal and then received a boost with the BC Enhancement Grant in 2023. With this, the board decided to open the library on Fridays for the next 3 years! Happy comments poured in about being open 5 days a week for the first time ever.

The Enhancement Grant has also helped to improve wages to meet with the rising cost of living. Wage schedules were reviewed and updated to retain new hires and award experience. These changes were merged with the 5-year operating budget for sustainability.

The board adopted the Accessibility Plan developed by Kootenay Library Accessibility Committee. Visit the website to read it and provide feedback on the plan or any barriers you face. The library website was updated for accessibility and staff were trained on how to create accessible content.

Lending library items has recovered and increased by 8% from 2019. Programs are back to normal with in person Story-time, Summer Reading Club, a variety of DIY 'maker' programs, author visits, school visits, and oneon-one digital learning sessions. We offered 110 program events and saw 922 participants.

The federal grant that we applied for in 2023 was not selected for funding, but we are not giving up. To date, over \$760,000 has been raised via donations, grants, and events. We are grateful for all the community support and will continue working towards a new library for Kaslo & Area D. Fundraising continued with nine events (see next page). The Canada Day Carnival was so much fun that we plan to do it again in 2024 – be sure to bring the whole family!
